

¿Cuántos años tienes?

Survey ten classmates to find out their age and the age of different people that they know. You may ask about their family members or friends. Keep a record of their answers, writing a complete sentence for each person. You should ask each person how old he or she is, and then ask about two other people (for a total of three questions for each of the ten classmates that you interview, giving you thirty answers overall.) Pay attention to the following example (but do not just use these questions):

You ask: ¿Cuántos años tienes, Shelley?

Shelly says: Tengo quince años.

You write: Shelley tiene quince años.

You ask: ¿Cuántos años tiene tu hermano?


Shelley says: Mi hermano tiene nueve años.


