

PHOTOGRAPHY SCAVENGER HUNT

Objective: At the end of this project, the student will demonstrate mastery of photo techniques, photo editing, cutline writing and Adobe Creative Suite (InDesign and PhotoShop) technology skills.

At the bottom of this page, you will find 26 words. Ten of those words must be used as the inspiration for a photo. How you interpret those words is up to you. (A website that can give you some ideas for interpretation: <http://sh1ft.org/26things>). You are to take the photos for this project using a digital camera and may not use ANY previously taken photos.

Each of those photos must use at least one photo technique (Leading Lines, Framing, Viewpoint, Movement, Emotion and Selective Focus). All 6 photo techniques must be used at least once in the project. In addition use of rule of thirds and fill the frame will also be graded for each photo.

Three photos must be grayscale; three photos must be full-color. The other 9 photos can appear how you think best showcases the photo content.

You will take each photo, edit the photo in PhotoShop, place it into an InDesign Document and write a proper cutline for it.

PhotoShop – You will use PhotoShop to crop the photo allowing the best interpretation and into a size that will fit into your InDesign document, change color modes, and minor editing corrections (reduce red-eye, fix levels). You are not to alter the basic photo (do not use any coloring skills or filtering).

InDesign Document – Your InDesign Document needs to have the following: Your name on each page of the letter-sized document. Each photo is to be properly placed and include a cutline, techniques used (Including rule of thirds or fill the frame. You'll list at least two techniques per photo), word interpreted and an explanation of your word interpretation.

You can decide column structure, use of screens, choice fonts and font sizes, photo sizes and overall page designs. Appearance will count.

Tips

- It may be a good idea to send me a list of fonts you want to use and make sure my computer also has them. You are being graded on appearance, and if I don't have the same font, that will deduct from appearance.
- You can choose what size to make your photos in InDesign; however, make sure the size showcases the photo in the best possible way. Be careful of photos that are too small to make out detail or too large for the photo's substance.
- Overall page design is up to you. The more creative you are the more points you will earn.

You will be **graded** on the following:

- Photo Composition (6 points per photo)
- Technique(s) used correctly used and listed (2 points per photo)
- Cutline Writing (3 points per photo)
- PhotoShop Editing (5 points per photo)
- Word Interpretation (4 points per photo)

Total Points from Photos: 200 points (20 pts per photo * 10 photos = 200)

InDesign Document: 75 points (note: there is not a way to turn in the photos without doing the InDesign document) (5 points each photo – photo, cutline, techniques used, word interpreted and interpretation explanation. 1 points for each of the three blank and white photos, 1 points for each of the three color photos, 19 points overall presentation)

Total points available: 275

Due Date: May 5 (Do not wait until last minute to do this project. There will be other assignments pertaining to the newspaper during this time.)
